Points of Interest Details

See number indicator on map side.

- 1. Rosston Boat Launch** - Built & maintained by CrCWA, PA Fish and Boat Commission & Manor Township.
- 2. Handicapped Fishing Pier & Embayment** - Below the dam outflow, CrCWA, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers & USDA NRCS created an embayment for fishing & built a handicap accessible pier, parking & picnicking area & rest rooms.
- 3. Armstrong Trail** - 52 mile public, non-motorized recreation rail-trail, open for hiking, jogging, running, bicycling, cross country skiing & horseback riding.
- 4. Crooked Creek Lake and Park** - Operated by the US Army Corps of Engineers. Available for camping, picnics, events, hiking, bicycling, boating, fishing, swimming & horseback riding.
- 5. Crooked Creek Environmental Learning Center** - Offers year-round environmental education and resource conservation programs.
- 6. Baker Trail** - A 132-mile hiking trail maintained by the Rachel Carson Trail Conservancy. It begins in Freeport, PA and extends to the Allegheny National Forest, north of Clarion, PA. CrCWA adopted a 3-mile section in 2009.
- 7. Crooked Creek Horse Park** - Developed by CrCWA, the Fort Armstrong Horseman's Association & Manor Township. Hosts rodeos, boarding stable & equestrian events.
- 8. Nellie Bly Memorial** - Crusading newspaper journalist, famous, in 1889-1890, for circling the globe in 72 days.
- 9. Keystone Lake** - Owned by RRI Energy & managed by PA Fish and Boat Commission. Excellent fishing (CrCWA has built over 100 fish habitat structures) & boating. Hydrographic fishing maps available from CrCWA.
- 10. Atwood Boat Access** - Boat launch, dock & parking area, shoreline stabilization & fish habitat on Route 210. Built by CrCWA, U.S. Army Reserves, Fish America Foundation, PA Fish and Boat Commission, Armstrong Conservation District & USDA NRCS.

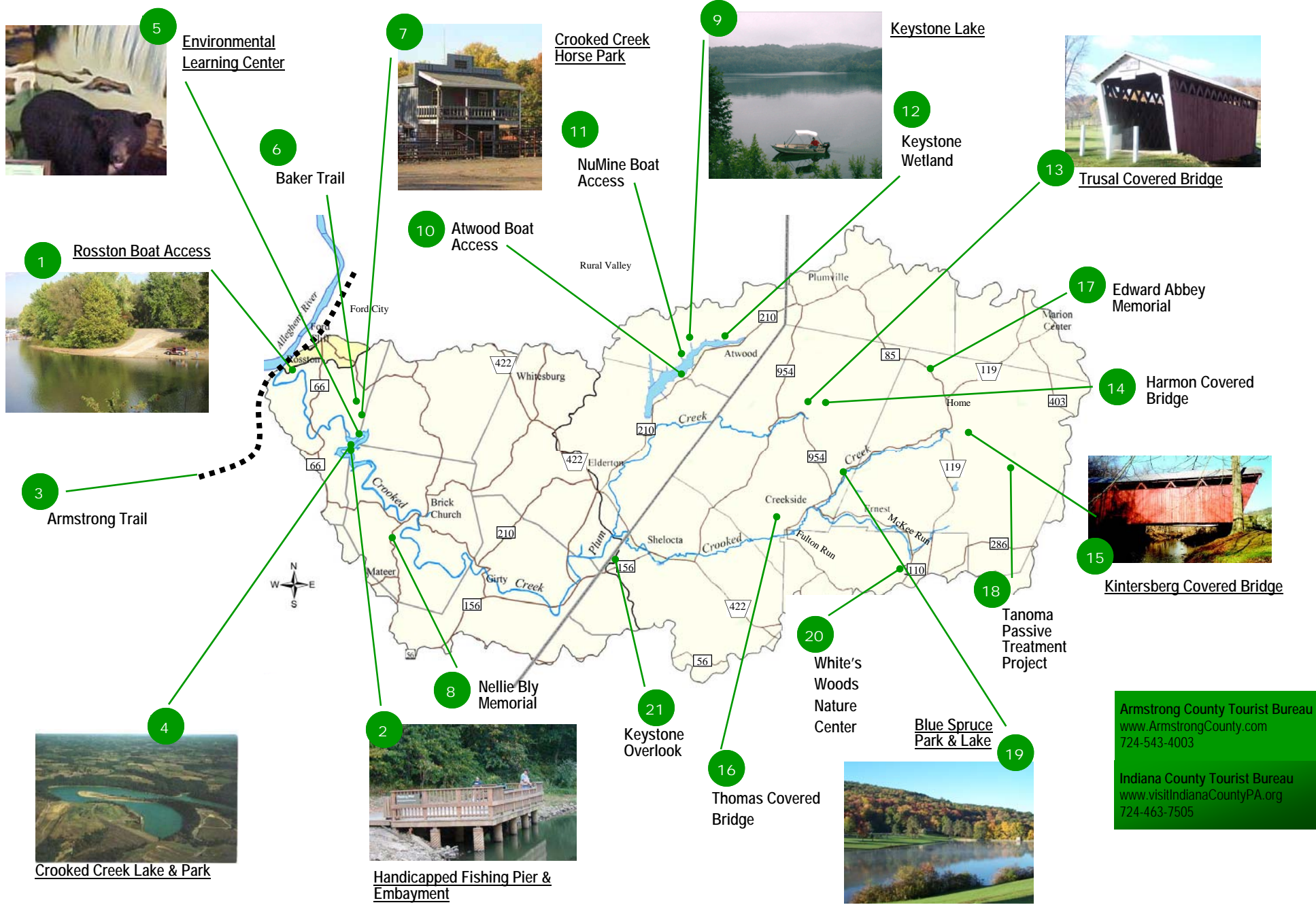
